On April 26 in Williamsburg, six guild members participated in a glass art show and sale on the College of William & Mary campus during Historic Garden Week. The show was very well attended and sales of \$2600 generated \$520 towards the Educational Scholarship fund. Give Local 757

Virginia Glass Guild raised a **total of \$4807** through the Give Local 757 fundraiser for local non-profit organizations. A total of **\$4050** resulted from the donations of **87** individuals and **\$757** was prize money awarded for having a donation made closest to sunrise (6:08am). The guild accomplished **96%** of our **\$5000** goal. These funds are vital to realize the exciting plans in the making for Virginia Glass Guild throughout the coming year. Many thanks to the members, their friends and family who made this year's fund drive a success. With this initial experience, the guild will set our goal higher next year and strive for **100%** participation from our membership.

Public Donation of Glass Art Children's Museum of Virginia June 4 and 5


Virginia Glass Guild held a hands-on event for children in the art classroom at the Children's Museum. The glass art experience involved each child creating a painting on paper with an image answering this one question: "What did you like the most about this Museum?". In addition, each child made a small fused glass tile and pendant of their own design. VGG member volunteers translated each child's painting into larger fused glass tiles that will later be kiln fired. The guild was able to interact with 48 children and their parents to introduce them to glass as an art form.

Completed glass tiles will be assembled to create an artwork installation within the Children's Museum. A grand unveiling event held in July will reveal a tiled wall with glass artwork inspired by the children. The guild will set up an information table at this event, documenting how the project was completed, from start to finish.

The Glass Doors Gallery is located in the main lobby of the Center in front of the Grand Ballroom. As its name suggests, the exhibition area consists of 3 glass enclosed display cases each 5 ft. W x 7ft H x 2 ft. D. Each case houses 2-3 glass shelves the width of the case. Guild members were invited to place artwork for sale in this exhibit, with dimensions capable of fitting in these cases. All artwork, sold or unsold, must remain on display for the entire duration of the exhibit. Artists are responsible for drop off and pick up of their artwork, but no additional volunteer hours are required. All sales are handled through the Center's gift shop and the guild treasury with a total commission of 40% charged.

Jurors' Lecture

Chrysler Museum of Art Auditorium One Memorial Place Norfolk, VA Artwork will be initially juried by Douglas & Katya Heller, using the digital images each artist submits with his or her application. Work will be selected for the show based on (1) the jurors' determinations, and (2) the available space in the galleries. The VGG Show Chairman and CHTAC Gallery Manager also have a vote on inclusion of all work.

Each applicant may enter up to 3 pieces of original glass artwork. Mixed media art (i.e. not 100% glass) must contain at least 30% of its form as glass. Work that has been previously exhibited at CHTAC (in *any* show) may not be submitted for consideration. Artwork that is accepted into the exhibit must remain in the gallery until the show closes, even if sold.

The guild will be using an online application system. You will be able to fill out the application, upload images, and pay your entry fee. Start working on your art and images so you'll be ready to submit your application. Your artwork must be completed and photographed by the time you submit your application.

If preferred, you may also complete the entry form manually and deliver it with a CD of your images to CHTAC. Your application is not complete until your entry fee is received.

A gala evening with food and drink, a fun Silent auction and Awards Presentation. Exhibit Awards and Educational Scholarship recipients will be announced starting at 7:00pm.

Since 1973 Heller Gallery has been recognized for playing a seminal role in promoting contemporary sculpture employing glass as its touch stone medium. For more than four decades Heller has exhibited the premier international artists who incorporate glass in their practice and has been a valuable resource for artists, museums, and collectors worldwide.

Numerous artworks have entered prestigious public collections as a direct result of Heller Gallery's exhibitions and advocacy. In the past few years alone the gallery has placed works in a dozen museum collections.

Though over the years its address has changed, Heller Gallery remains a unique destination in New York City's vibrant art scene. The gallery is now located at 303 Tenth Avenue near the 28th Street entrance to the acclaimed High Line Park.



Douglas Heller has been the co-owner and director of the Heller Gallery since 1973. He has organized hundreds of group and solo exhibitions, including the landmark show *Glass America* 1978 at Lever House in New York City. In the 1990s, he organized *Glass Japan*, the first major documented exhibition of Japanese Studio Glass presented in the United States. He also organized The *Prague Glass Prize*, the first major exhibition of Czech Studio Glass produced after the "Velvet Revolution" in the Czech Republic.

Heller is a founding board member of the Creative Glass Center of America and is on the Advisory Board of UrbanGlass. He is a former vice president of the Associates of the American Craft Museum and a Fellow of The Corning Museum of Glass.

He has served as a jurist for the New Jersey State Council of the Arts and the Ohio Arts Council's Major Fellowship Program. He also has been a jurist for The Corning Museum of Glass *New Glass Review*, and has served on the faculty of the American Arts Course of Sotheby's Educational Studies.

Katya Heller was born and raised in Czechoslovakia by an American mother and Czech father. Her first profession was as an interpreter for personalities as diverse as Czech President Vaclav Havel, Walter Cronkite, Frank Zappa, and the Dali Lama.

Heller moved to the United States in 1987 and by 1990 had begun a career as an arts professional, working with Dale Chihuly as the primary organizer of several of his international projects. From 1991 to 1994, she worked at the Henry Art Gallery, University of Washington in Seattle, WA. In 1996, she became associate director at the Elliott Brown Gallery in Seattle, and in 1998 moved on to spend a year working in the planning and development of the Museum of Glass in Tacoma, WA.

In 1999, she relocated to New York City and began work as associate director of Heller Gallery. She is currently a member of the Board of Directors of UrbanGlass, and in 2006 was cochair of the organization's major fundraising event, the Glassblowers Ball and Auction. She also serves on the Advisory Board of the Czech Center - New York.

Silent Auction

The annual Silent Auction is the Guild's primary fundraiser supporting the Educational Scholarship Program. The Guild has increased the scholarship amount to \$2000 over the past few years, but the Silent Auction proceeds have not quite kept pace with these increases. Last year three guild members received scholarship awards and will be required to make a presentation to the guild sharing what they have learned. Each of these scholarship recipients is expected to donate one piece to this year's auction in appreciation for the support they received. A similar commitment from each guild member would insure a fantastic auction and very good chance at meeting our goal of \$2000 in proceeds.

Please support the Silent Auction with your pieces, large and small, and encourage friends and family to come and bid on beautiful artglass by local artists!

Contributing artists will be able to set a minimum bid and increments for their donated artwork and the proceeds from successfully auctioned pieces will be split 40% artist, 40% guild and 20% CHTAC. Also consider a *Buy It Now* price for each piece, giving bidders the opportunity to secure their favorite piece at a higher price, but still below the established value for the work.

Committee members are needed for organizing the Silent Auction. Please consider supporting the guild with a few volunteer hours to make this our most successful Silent Auction to date.

Auction pieces should be delivered to The Charles H Taylor Arts Center during the artwork drop off dates for the 29th Annual Glass Juried Exhibition, October 7-9.

Educational Scholarship

Virginia Glass Guild is offering \$2000 in educational scholarships this year. Award money this year will be payable to Glass Art Society for a Full Member Conference Pass or a Full-Time Student Conference Pass to GAS Conference 2017 to be held in Norfolk, June 1-3. Members are eligible to apply for a scholarship if they have paid their VGG dues for membership year 2016-2017 and have been a member of the Guild for at least one year by the application deadline. An additional condition of eligibility will be to submit proof of GAS membership through June 3, 2017, which is required to register for the conference. If you are applying for a Full-Time Student Conference Pass scholarship, you must be a Full-Time Student GAS Member, supplying GAS with the appropriate credentials. Educational Scholarship recipients from 2014 and 2015 will be ineligible to reapply this year.

In addition to the above requirements, scholarship recipients will be required to volunteer 4 hours at the Virginia Glass Guild Tech Booth during the conference. Recipients will also be required to submit images and applications for both GAS related VGG exhibitions. Details on both of these events

can be found in the following pages of this newsletter. Educational Scholarship Applications will include 5 images and descriptions of artwork consistent with the quality of work you intend to submit for consideration for these two exhibits and a resume not to exceed two pages. The application is found at the end of this newsletter or can be downloaded from the VGG website.

Douglas and Katya Heller, who are the jurors for our 29th Annual Juried Exhibition, will review the applications and award the scholarships.

The Virginia Glass Guild, formerly known as The Peninsula Glass Guild, was established in 1986 to promote quality glass art in the community and to provide a forum for glass arts. The Virginia Glass Guild is organized for educational, artistic and charitable purposes as a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization. With this name change in 2015, artists, businesses and supporters living and working throughout the Commonwealth of Virginia are welcome to join the Guild and further the goals that were set by the Founding Members. These goals include the sharing of artistic ideas, expanding knowledge and awareness of glass as an art form, and stretching artistic imagination through exploration of glass as an artistic medium. Members achieve these goals through an annual public donation of art glass or educational materials related to glass, the purchase and subsequent donation of art, or grants towards those ends, to organizations or individuals consistent with the goals of the Guild. To promote awareness of glass as an art form, the Guild has sponsored the Annual Juried Exhibition at Charles H Taylor Arts Center in Hampton for the past 28 years, in addition to smaller exhibits in venues throughout Virginia.

Taylor Arts Center. Winners will be announced during the opening reception awards presentation on Sunday October 16.

The winner is expected to enter a piece of their artwork for auction in the 2017 Silent Auction, the Guild's primary fundraiser for scholarships.
